Advocacy project to mobilize the government of Sikkim, policymakers, farmers and civil societies of Sikkim, with the objective of pushing the Government of India for extending the proposed fertilizer subsidy policy towards organic fertilizers and traditional fertilization practices and knowledge.

- Data collection from published and primary sources- interactions with various stakeholders at the village level. Data gathered include details of cropping patterns, fertilizer usage, and production statistics under both chemical and organic agriculture.

 - Assisted in the networking, and provided inputs during proposal writing to win an *Arghyam* funded project of Rs. 28, 11,688 on rejuvenation and conservation of mountain springs in the dry districts of Sikkim (*Dhara-Vikas*), which is now scaled up by the state government in convergence with National Rural Employment Guarantee Act (NREGA).
