Students planning to travel early to Spain to pursue personal travels must not enter Spanish territory more than 15 days before the program begins, as arriving too early could cause legal complications with the in-country registration. SIT will send me supporting documents for my visa application, which will be delivered during the two months before the new semester, allowing time for me to apply for and obtain my visa before the program start date. Though every effort will be made to deliver these documents as early as possible, SIT cannot make special arrangements to accommodate students' individual pre-program travel plans or other activities which might conflict with the visa application process.
