VISA PROCESS

Switzerland

Due to the complicated nature of the visa application process for Switzerland, please return this form acknowledging your understanding of the following information. SIT will send you visa instructions in early April/May for the fall semester or early October/November for the spring semester. It can take up to 12 weeks for the Swiss consulate to process your visa application. Please include ALL of the information below so that Travisa may begin preparing your visa documents.

CHECK ALL BOXES BELOW.

I understand that:

- □ I am responsible for sending in my visa application materials as specified by my admissions counselor.
- □ In order to participate on the Switzerland program, I must obtain a Type D Visa.
- □ I am responsible for my own pre/post program-travel.
- Swiss visas for U.S. passport holders are processed through <u>New York only</u>. Do not try and go through another location. Moroccan tourist visas for U.S. passport holders are granted on-arrival. Non-U.S. passport holders should plan accordingly and research the visa process and apply in advance.
- SIT cannot assist students planning to remain in Switzerland for periods longer than the program dates.
- The Swiss consulates may change visa requirements and fees at any time. Before beginning the visa application process, I must verify the most current requirements and fees through the consulate's website (if not using Travisa).
- Issuance of visas is at the sole discretion of the Swiss consulate. SIT assumes no responsibility for the application process or if the participant's visa is denied.
- SIT has no affiliation with the Swiss consulates.
- I have read and understand the pre-visa checklist, and I will send my visa materials to Travisa by May 14th for the Fall semester, or November 15th for the Spring semester.
- Students without a US passport may be subject to additional or different requirements for obtaining a Swiss or Moroccan visa or meeting other conditions of entry into the country. Many countries require individuals to apply for visas in person at the relevant embassy or consulate located in their country of citizenship. We

strongly recommend that you contact the embassy of each country the program will be traveling to (i.e. Switzerland and Morocco) very early in the process to confirm visa and/or entry requirements applicable to your country of citizenship and determine next steps while allowing plenty of time to apply. If the foreign consulate(s) permits non-US passport holders to apply for the required visa from within the United States, applicants are encouraged to contact Travisa Visa Services. As an experienced visa agent working closely with a number of SIT programs, Travisa may be able to assist you in your visa application process. A service discount is available by entering "SIT" as the corporate code in your Travisa online application. It is your responsibility to confirm and complete the visa application process particular to your situation, and to keep your admissions counselor informed.
