SIT Study Abroad considers the admissions process to be an important component of the study abroad experience. We hope that our in-depth application and subsequent conversations will be useful to you as you focus on your goals for studying abroad and prepare for a meaningful term. Please complete and return the following application materials to us. We strongly encourage you make copies of all submitted materials for your records.

Application Deadlines

Please note that SIT has a rolling admissions policy. This means that it is important to apply early, as some programs fill prior to their stated deadlines. SIT Study Abroad welcomes applications from undergraduate students currently enrolled and in good academic standing with a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.5 at any college or university. For semester programs, you must have completed at least one year of college-level coursework at the time of application and preferably two years for IHP/Comparative programs. Only one semester of college coursework is required for summer programs.

Final deadlines for the summer term:

• April 1 for all summer programs

Final deadlines for the fall term:

- April 1 for the Iceland program
- May 1 for Switzerland programs
- May 15 for all other programs

Final deadlines for the spring term:

- October 1 for Czech Republic and Iceland programs
- November 1 for all other programs

What Happens Next

Once we have received all your application materials, including approval of participation, academic reference and official transcripts, our admissions committee will review your application. Applications are reviewed by the admissions committee in batches. Program sizes are small; for this reason, the admissions committee may limit the number of offers given to students from the same institution to create a positive and varied group experience. You may be contacted to discuss your application or be asked to submit additional information. Offers of admission are generally made within three weeks. You will then have two weeks to reserve your space in the program by submitting the appropriate confirmation materials. A list of these items will be provided with your offer of admission. These items include medical information, a non-refundable deposit, and other materials specific to your program.

Important Reminders

If accepted, you will be required to provide us with a copy of your passport and SIT medical forms.

Passport

Your passport must be valid for at least six months after the completion of the program. If yours will expire before this date, or if you do not have a passport, you should apply for a new one immediately. It typically takes 4-6 weeks to obtain a passport. Depending on the visa requirements for your program or if you are applying close to the application deadline, you may need to expedite your passport application. Please check with SIT to see if it is necessary to expedite your application.

Medical Report

The SIT medical forms must be completed by you and in conjunction with your physician or medical professional. At minimum, Part 1 of the medical form and a scheduled appointment date with your physician or medical professional must be submitted with your confirmation materials. **To avoid delays, make an appointment as soon as you submit your application.**

Homestay Letter

Required with applications for Argentina, Chile, Ecuador, Madagascar, Mexico, Peru, & Senegal. All other program applicants will be requested to supply a homestay letter if an offer of admission is extended. **Not Required** for Nepal: Geoscience in the Himalaya (Summer).

Write a one-page letter to your homestay family, preferably typed. Beginning with "Dear Host Family," thank them for accepting you into their home and tell them about yourself. Describe your interests, your community, your family, or whatever you feel might give your hosts some background and ways to better engage with you when you arrive.

- Insert an electronic photo of yourself into the document.
- For all programs with a language prerequisite: Write your letter in that language, no matter how minimal your grasp.
- Please do not have the letter proofread or edited by another person.

Email your homestay letter as a Microsoft Word document or PDF to applications@sit.edu. Use your full name in the title of the document: "LastName_FirstName_HomestayLetter."

Please Note: Due to varying homestay placement procedures and the unavailability of translators, in some cases, your letter may not be read by your homestay family. There will not be sufficient time for your homestay family to respond to you prior to your participation in the program. We are not able to give out family contact information prior to the program start date.
